Boosting your Performance

Before the half term, Mr Butterworth delivered an online assembly about <u>metacognition</u>. Metacognition is a complex sounding word, but it essentially means **thinking and knowing explicitly about how you learn and actively monitoring your own learning**. This means learning from the process to help you to reach your goal.

It therefore requires <u>self-regulation</u>. This means actively thinking about what you do about your learning. For example, monitoring, evaluating and controlling your own learning - making changes and adjustments in order to achieve success.

It is worth noting that: "Metacognition makes a unique contribution to learning over and above the influence of intellectual ability. Learners who use metacognitive strategies are likely to be able to achieve more. Research shows that improving a learner's metacognitive practices may compensate for any cognitive limitations they have."

Year 13

Well done to our Year 13 students, the majority of whom have completed their <u>final Trial Exam Series</u>. How can they use metacognitive strategies now?

It is important to consider the following questions for each of their subjects:

- Did I complete the exam paper? If not, why not?
- Did I try every question? If not, why not?
- Is timing an issue?
- Is stamina an issue?
- Where are my gaps?
- What needs to change?

What can be done differently?

This self-awareness is key to making improvements for the forthcoming public exams.

Year 12

Year 12 students are already preparing for their <u>first Trial Exam Series</u>, which commences at the end of April. **How can they use metacognitive strategies?**

It is important to consider the following questions for each of their subjects:

- How is this going?
- Is my approach working?
- Do I need to change anything?
- Do I need to think differently?
- What are my strengths?
- What are my weaknesses?

It is also useful for parents and carers to ask their son or daughter the above questions, to help them to monitor progress and so that students can make continual improvements.



Bromley Rotary Club Youth Awards

The Bromley Rotary Club Youth Awards took place in our performance hall on Friday 26th January. These awards are to recognise and celebrate young people's contributions to the community. Five students from our sixth-form attended the event to receive their award.



Matas Seilius, Emily Taylor, Audrey Blanco and Ciara Beevers received a joint award for volunteering at the Bethlem Hospital Community Centre. They have been volunteering weekly after an extensive training programme which prepares them to work with mental health patients.

They are on befriending scheme where patients with learning disabilities and/or mental health needs come into the café where they can take part in activities arranged by the students. The students coordinate the activities, arranging and leading small creative and social activities such as making jigsaws, playing pool, playing cards and organising bingo sessions, and helping at the Christmas party.

They have been there for the patients to talk to and have become very well known by the patients who regularly ask for them and some would make a point to come every week knowing that they would be there.



James Wickham received his award for volunteering as a Beaver leader for the last four years. He helps run activities and plan the upcoming weekly sessions. He helps and guides the Beavers when working towards their next badges as well as teaching them new skills and sports. When new Beavers join, he makes sure they are included in all the activities.


