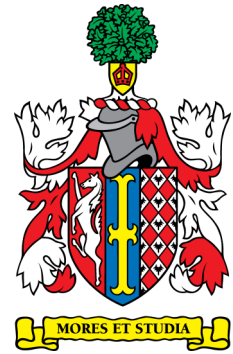

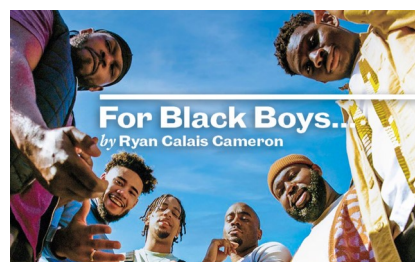
During August, Zoe will travel to Thailand to work with children in a Kindergarten and can't wait to begin her adventure:-

"As a 16 year old full time student, deciding to apply for this international programme was entirely impulsive for me. I thought of the idea and immediately acted on it. I researched into international volunteering experiences, contemplating and eliminating so many companies and locations before selecting my final destination. I speculated between wildlife conservation, construction and many other programme opportunities before finally landing on childcare."

Working with children was a given as I knew I wanted to work with a team to improve the education experience of less fortunate children, whilst also having the opportunity to backpack across the globe at the same time. Whilst helping others, I hope to also develop myself as a person, seeing life through someone else's eyes. The support I have received from countless individuals including my family, friends, staff and so many other key workers within our school has been overwhelming. The opportunities I have been offered are outstanding, with continual proposals being made to make the most out of this once in a lifetime experience."

Focus on Societies and Clubs...

African Caribbean Society



On Thursday, as part of our African Caribbean Society (ACS) here at Langley Park School for Boys, we took some Year 12's (alongside some from LPGS) to watch the theatre performance 'For Black Boys Who Have Considered Suicide When the Hue Gets Too Heavy'. The performance follows six young Black men who meet for group therapy sessions and take it in turns to open up about the beliefs and experiences that have shaped them into the people they've become. It was a powerful and deeply moving meditation on Black masculinity and the various non-monolithic experiences of Black life in 21st-century Britain. The trip was an opportunity for the Year 12 students to listen to an open discussion about mental health, relationships, prejudice and toxic masculinity, subjects that they discuss during their fortnightly PSHE lessons.



"The play was heart touching yet jolly, as it showed the harsh reality of being a Black boy living in a totally different environment. It shows how Black people change their social status to match their current environment and be someone they're not. The play has allowed me to appreciate the journey black people have taken on to go to better themselves, to open up and not allow darkness to emulsify our souls. The crowd was very diverse and very interactive with the whole play showing how socially accepting society has become (yet still far to go) and how Black people and people of any race can strive, achieve, succeed and innovate together without segregation and oppression."

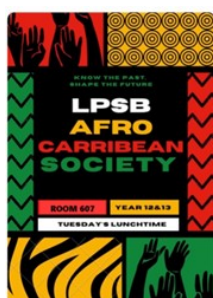
A Sixth Form-led Men's Mental Health Society:

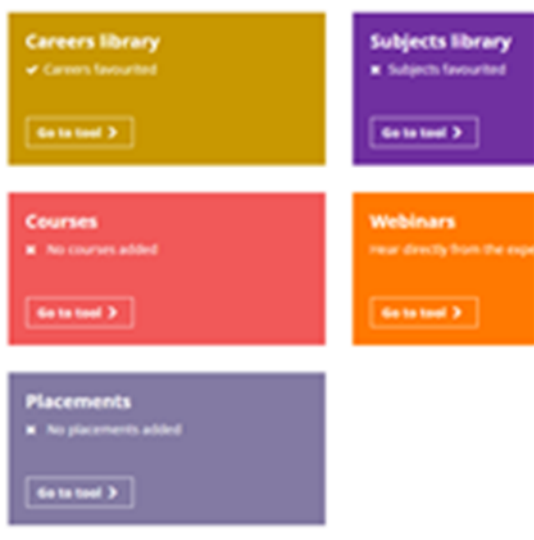

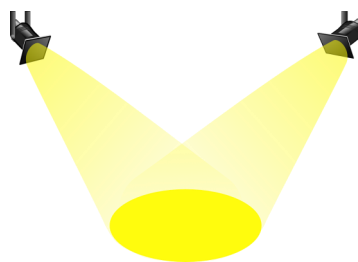

2-0 Win v KCS Wimbledon

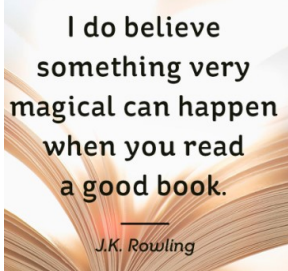
5-0 Win v Framlingham, with Teva Geffen channelling his inner Frank Lampard to score a brace!

Staff from other schools and tournament officials were extremely complimentary about the boys' attitude and the way they played through the day.

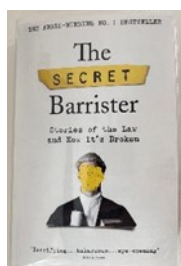
A word from the Library...

The two things you have the power to control in life are your thoughts and your actions. This is great news because these both have a huge impact on how your life turns out. Change your thoughts and you change your world

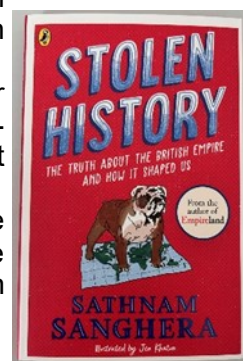

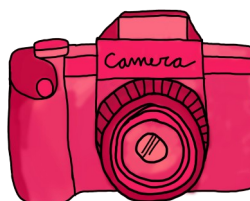
