Useful Reminders

Lanyards and ID Cards

- These are required for every student in the Sixth Form
- You are required to have both the lanyard and the ID card
- These should be visible at all times while you are on site
- This includes after school
- These **must be worn round the neck**
- This is an essential part of our safeguarding policy
- Failure to have your lanyard means you will be sent home
- If you subsequently miss lessons, then you will be expected to catch up this time

Failure to return to school will be treated as truancy and result in further sanctions

Lost Lanyards and ID Cards

All students who purchased Up Learn by 14th May should have received an email from Up Learn to their <u>school email address</u> with details about how to set up their account.

More than 70 students have signed up, and we hope that they enjoy making use of this resource over the coming weeks.

Our next signup update is Monday 1st July. This will enable students to make use of the resources during the last weeks of term and over the summer.

A reminder that LPSB have formed an agreement with "Up Learn" to be able to offer <u>all</u> students <u>subsidised</u> places on their courses. We have trialled Up Learn with our current Year 13 cohort and have received very positive feedback from them and other schools.

Why did you apply?

I was very lucky as the first apprenticeship I applied for got back to me and offered me an interview and I managed to secure the job position. I knew I wanted to work in business development, so this role is perfect for me.



1. Always double check and reread emails for any spelling mistakes and to make sure grammar is on point

2. Reply back to emails in a timely manner.

3. When I got the interview, I made sure I was on time and wore a shirt and tie to give a good professional first impression.

4. Make sure to do research on the company beforehand, this proved useful as I was able to answer the questions I was asked during the interview.

5. Also make sure to ask good questions too, for example, "What does the average working day like?" and "What is the team like?"

6. Just make sure you are confident and have a notepad near you with details and you will be fine!

Year 12 Geography Field Trip

Year 12 Geography Fieldwork

Our Year 12 Geographers have started their independent investigations down on the South Coast on a series of fieldtrips down to Birling Gap and Camber Sands in East Sussex. Travelling by minibus down to both gorgeous coastal locations the students embarked on the data collection section of their non-examination assessment. The course-work they will produce forms 20% of their final grade, so it was brilliant to see the effort and endeavour they put in to exploring and investigating the two contrasting environments. The students develop their own research questions and lines of enquiry, so it's been fantastic to see such a diligent group of students taking ownership over their research.

Broadly, the students are either investigating the varying causes of coastal recession at Birling Gap, which forms part of the spectacular Seven Sisters coastline or they will be looking into the human causes of damage to the dunes at Camber Sands. Every year we are so impressed by the work rate and effort and of course, the understandable enthusiasm for getting out and doing some Geography in the open air!

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



Med Prep- year 12 PBL session

We were delighted to have medical student Fraser Beard- LPSB alumni 2020, in the careers hub to run a PBL (problem-based learning) session with our year 12 Med Prep group.

PBL is the preferred teaching style at many medical schools these days, and allows students to learn though case studies, looking at patient history, medical notes such as ECGs, haemodynamic data, and family history. Fraser led the students in case about a young 14-year-old male with centralised chest pain. The students were then able to talk though the case and come up with a diagnosis of HOCM- hypertrophic obstructive cardiomyopathy. This was an innovative way to teach, as our students were able to provide their own reasoning based on the information. He also discussed the Gillick competencies and Fraser guidelines which students should know about when treating children. Fraser is now a 4th year medical student at Hull and York medical school and wishes to specialise in remote medicine one day. He regularly comes back to support LPSB Med prep.


