Langley Park School for Boys Celebrates Outstanding A-Level and BTEC Results

Langley Park School for Boys is celebrating another year of exceptional sixth form success, with students securing places at prestigious universities including Oxford and Cambridge, alongside outstanding A-Level and BTEC results.

These achievements reflect the hard work, determination and ambition of our students, supported by the dedication of staff and the strength of our school community. With over 300 students receiving A-Level results, nearly 900 individual qualifications were awarded this summer.

58% of A-Level grades were awarded at A*-B, with 27.2% achieving the top A*-A grades and an impressive 83% awarded at A*-C. The overall pass rate stands at 99.3%, highlighting the consistently high standards achieved by students and staff alike.

Our BTEC students have also excelled, with 70% achieving Distinction grades, 95% attaining Merit or above, and a 100% overall pass rate. These achievements reflect the broad range of talents across our student body and the diverse academic pathways we offer.

Students have secured places at a wide range of highly regarded universities, including Oxford, Cambridge and other Russell Group institutions, while others have successfully gained competitive apprenticeships and employment opportunities.

We are particularly proud to recognise three of our highest achievers this year:

- **Archie Warnock (A*A*A*)** will study Medicine at the University of Cambridge.
- **Fionn Crossingham (A*A*A*)** will study Geography at the University of Oxford.
- **Freya Myers (A*A*A)** will study Philosophy and Theology at the University of Oxford.

Across the curriculum, students achieved exceptional outcomes in a number of subjects. Further Mathematics was a particular strength, with 63.6% of students awarded A* to A grades and 86.4% achieving B or above. French also delivered outstanding results, with 62.5% securing A* to A grades and 87.5% achieving B+. Mathematics, the school's largest A-Level cohort with 99 entries, saw 44.4% of students awarded A* to A grades and 71.7% achieving B+. Strong performances were also recorded in English Literature, where 39.2% achieved A* to A grades, and Economics, where 36.4% secured A* to A grades and 72.7% achieved B+. Media Studies continued its excellent track record, with 64.7% achieving B+ grades and 92.7% attaining C+ or above, while Drama delivered an outstanding pass profile, with 77.8% achieving B+ and 94.4% securing C+ or above. Together, these results demonstrate the strength, breadth and consistency of achievement across the sixth form.

We look forward to seeing the positive contribution these young people will make in higher education, apprenticeships, the workplace and wider society. We congratulate every student on their success and thank our dedicated staff, supportive families and governors for the role they have played in helping our students achieve their ambitions.
