Sixth Form Reminders

Lanyards and ID Cards

- These are required for every student in the Sixth Form
- You are required to have both the lanyard and the ID card
- These should be visible at all times while you are on site
- This includes after school
- These **must be worn round the neck**
- This is an essential part of our safeguarding policy
- Failure to have your lanyard means you will be sent home
- If you subsequently miss lessons, then you will be expected to catch up this time

Failure to return to school will be treated as truancy and result in further sanctions

Lost Lanyards and ID Cards

- You need to report to Ms Cross in room 101
- Ms Cross will contact home and issue you a temporary lanyard in exchange for a deposit
- Your deposit will be returned once you have returned your lanyard
- You will need a replacement lanyard for each day until your new card has arrived
- New lanyards and ID cards can be purchased on sQuid
- New Card £2
- New Lanyard and Card Holder £3
- New Lanyards and ID cards will be collected from Ms Cross in room 101
- If you lose your temporary lanyard you will need to pay for an additional replacement and be issued an ACU





Sixth Form Reminders

Punctuality

- Students must register punctually at 8.20am every morning and at 1.05pm every afternoon.
- If you arrive late, you **must** sign in at the late desk in the Sixth Form Study Centre. Failure to do so will result in you receiving an unauthorised absence mark.
- If you are 20 minutes late in the morning you will be given a blue card which will mean a 30-minute detention after school.

Economics Society Update

10th October 2024:

"This week during Economics Society we debated whether an increase in taxation would be good for the UK economy.

Around 40 students showed up and we split them into 6 tables with half agreeing with the statement whilst the other half disagreed with the statement.

Some amazing points were made by the year 12 students, for example ' An increase in tax on excise duties like sugar would lead to lower consumption of an unhealthy demerit good, therefore this may lead to an improvement in the public health of the UK. This, in turn, creates less demand for healthcare services - lowering their burden - and improves work ethic within society.'

Overall, this was an incredibly productive lunch-time with many Year 12 students opting to stay in *Economics Society for the foreseeable future.*"

LPSB kicked off our Black History Month Celebrations with whole school assemblies lead by Pearl Apaw, Finley Holness, Aryan Singh, Devon Tulloch and Zara Uzokwe; who are all members of our 6th form African Caribbean Society (ACS). The theme for this year's National Black History Month is 'Reclaiming Narratives' so during our assemblies, students and staff were taught about stories of black people who have been ignored, sidelined or never heard of; and encouraged to reflect on the importance of remembering and retelling stories. For instance, Yvonne Conolly who was United Kingdom's first female Black Headteacher in 1969; and John Edmonstone who was born enslaved in Guyana, travelled to Scotland and became the very teacher that taught Charles Darwin taxidermy which helped develop his theory of Evolution.

On Friday 11th October, members of the Sixth Form African Caribbean Society hosted the brilliant 'Changemakers' panel discussion. Pearl Apaw, Kia Mohammedi and Devon Tulloch were highly impressive with their questioning. The panel included some inspirational black people from various industries:
